About the survey. The Delhi Assembly Election 2025 Pre and Post poll survey was conducted between January 29 and February 6, 2025 among 3137 electors at 140 polling stations spread across 28 assembly constituencies of Delhi. The sampling design adopted was multi-stage systematic random sampling. The Assembly Constituencies were randomly selected using the probability proportional to size method. Thereafter, five polling stations within each of the sampled constituencies were selected using the systematic random sampling method. Within each polling station, 40 electors were randomly sampled from the electoral roll using the systematic random sampling method. Of these 40, 22 interviews were targeted. The interviews of electors were conducted face-to-face at their homes where voting will be taken place in their area. The findings shown here have been weighted by gender, religion and caste group based on Census 2011 data and by the Actual vote shares secured by the main parties—BJP, Congress, AAAP and other smaller parties.
